BASS, Lorenzo. Doctor Caven Goes To Douglas Is To Make Examination of Wounds of Bass. Ranger Webb Gets Hearing Today on Charge of Having Murdered Lorenzo Bass at Douglas Last Sunday. Dr. C. L. Caven was called to Douglas yesterday afternoon for the purpose of making an examination of the gunshot wounds, which resulted in the death of Lorenzo Bass last Sunday night. Bass was killed by Arizona Ranger W. W. Web, who will be taken this morning from Tombstone to Douglas. Before Justice Johnson in Douglas today Webb will be given his preliminary hearing on the charge of murder. He has retained Attorney Lowell to defend him. The territory will be represented by Allan R. English. Both sides are prepared to introduce a large amount of testimony. It is understood that Dr. Caven has been called to Douglas by the friends of Bass. His testimony will probably be introduced to show that Web that have ever been fought out in the floor, though just what bearing this has on the case has not been learned. There is little doubt that this will be one of the hardest legal battles that have ever been found out in the courts of this county. The Arizona Rangers are working night and day in behalf of Webb, and friends of the dead man are leaving no stone unturned to dig up evidence that will tend to show that Web was in the wrong. The feeling in Douglas has subsided to such an extent that there is no further fear of trouble between the friends of the dead man and those of the rangers. The case will be tried out in a fair and honorable manner, and the law allowed to take its course. The condition of McDonald, who was injured by accident or by a monte dealer, who is alleged to have fired the shot that entered his lung, was much improved last night. The doctors have as yet been unable to find the bullet, and have ceased probing for a time for fear they may do the patient serious injury. The outcome of this case will be looked forward to with a great deal of interest. The two principals both have many friends in the county, who believe that their favorite was without doubt in the right. When her only surviving relative, Tom Bean and his wife, visited her at the hospital last Thursday, she rallied from her last illness and joked with him. A colorful history was Mrs. Bean's for her parents were of British Royalty. Her father who was a famous doctor and surgeon in his adopted state of Georgia had an unusual way of disciplining his nine children. He would make them sit down and learn Latin. With this background of study, it was not hard for Mrs. Bean to learn the medicine that her father tutored her in. She lacked only one year of finishing her course when her husband came along and she fell in love with him. In the meantime she and her parents and brothers and sisters had moved to Belle County, Texas. From Texas the young couple went to Mexico with a group of other pioneering young people. Here their two sons were born with Jim passing away later. The Beans later came to Bisbee and then to Dos Cabezas where Mr. Bean was a miner until his death in 1941. He, too, retained his vitality and was 85 at the time of his passing. The medicine that Mrs. Bean had learned helped her friends and neighbors in many ways. An aching tooth was often extracted for those who could not afford to pay and many a baby was helped into the world by this Good Samaritan. She was a tower of strength to all those with whom she came in contact, and her knowledge of medicine was used over and over. At the graveside services which were held in the Dos Cabezas cemetery Wednesday afternoon, Rev. J. Marvin Davis of the Methodist Church presided. Mrs. Bean had held life membership in this church. He also was superintendent of the penitiary [sic] and was a veteran of the Spanish-American war, seeing service in the Cuban campaign. In 1879 he came to Cochise county and became the county's first sheriff an office which at that time was combined with tax-collector and assessor. He was appointed by Governor Fremont. As sheriff he rendered conspicuous service against the bands of Mexican and American bandits who had rendered life dangerous and rather unprofitable along the Mexican border, and took an active part in suppressing the cattle war which was an outgrowth of the Wyatt-Earp feud in Tombstone. The death of Behan marks the passing of another Arizona pioneer, who helped make history, and his demise causes a pang of deep regret among the many friends who knew him. BILLING, Frank E. Frank Billing Was Name Of Dead Miner. Walked from Naco to Bisbee Looking for Employment, Went to Work at Lowell and Killed 15 Minutes Later. The young man who met a tragic death in the Lowell mine on Tuesday evening was yesterday identified as Frank E. Billing, of 2610 California street, Denver, Colorado. The manner in which he met death is not known positively, as he was alone at the time, and there were no eye witnesses to the accident. The body of the deceased is being held at the International Undertaking Parlors, and his family has been communicated with, asking for disposition of

the body. The inquest took place yesterday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock at Judge Hogan's office at Lowell. Michael Murphy, Mike Hamon and Leonhard Lochr, all of them employes [sic] in the Lowell shaft, testified in regard to the accident, but as no one was on the "dinky" with the deceased between the 1200 and 1000 levels when the accident happened, it will forever remain a mystery how the deceased, who claimed to be a miner when he applied for work, came to be caught between the cage and the timbers and came to his death. Michael Keath, a boilermaker employed at the Czar shaft, testified to coming from Benson with Billing, and to walking up from Naco together. They both found immediate employment, though at different mines. It was from Keath that it was learned that Billing was a married man, and had a family at No. 2610 California street, in Denver, Colorado, and that he was well connected there. The deceased evidently was a man who liked to roam about the country from place to place, never staying long in any one lacation [sic]. From letters and other articles belonging to him it was evident that he was a man of above education, and it certainly was tragical for him to come to such an untimely and sudden end in this camp at the very beginning of his first shift. It appears that he went down to the wrong level and was sent up to the 1000 level; before he reached this level, and not having been underground over ten minues [sic] the accident occurred which caused his death. The dinky was carefully examined after the happening and found in perfect condition and order, so it is a matter of surmise merely, whether the deceased bent his head over and was caught by the wall plates, or whether he droppen [sic] his bucket and stopping to pick it up was caught, or whether for some reason he fainted and thus received his fatal injuries. The dead man's people in Denver were communicated with by wire, and arrangements will undoubtedly be made with the International Undertaking Company, where the body now lies, for its removal to Denver. The verdict of the cornoer's [sic] jury is that the deceased was an American, Frank E. Billing by name, aged about 25 years, and that he came to his death by a sheer accident, through no fault or negligence of any one connected with the Lowell mine. This verdict is signed by F. G. Borgeson, who died at the Johnson House in this city on Thursday of last week, was yesterday shipped by Undertaker Hubbard to Billingham, Wash., the late home of the deceased. Accompanying the remains back was E. Korsboen, a brother-in law of the dead man. Mr. Korsboen arrived here early in the week in response to telegraphic advices of the death of his relative, and after identifying the body was given its possession for return to the widow and three children who survive in Bellingham. Following the death of Mr. Borgeson here, his place of residence was ascertained through papers on his person, and inquiry made of the Washington town developed the fact that the deceased was one of its most prominent citizens. It was also later ascertained that there was \$8,500 on deposit to his credit at the miners and Merchants bank I n httscii cmf cmf vbg vbgkgje bank in this city. In his home city Mr. Borgeson was rated to be worth in excess of \$200,000, he having considerable property interests beside large cash sums on deposit in bank. The deceased had been in the city only four days when his death occurred from pneumonia, which caused him to take to his bed shortly after his arrival here. He was a man of powerful build, weighing 240 pounds, and when the dread affliction fastened upon him it made rapid inroads. He had come to the city with some expectation of locating, having for some time felt that the climate of Washington was not suited to his health, though he appeared in robust condition. Shortly after six o'clock last night a fatal accident occurred at the Bisbee West mine in which Frank Bowman and Alex Duder lost their lives. The company had been hoisting water all day from their lower levels and the rope and guide had become wet and the cold weather froze the cross-head, and when Bowman and Duder had descended in the bucket down about 500 feet the frozen cross-head broke and gave way dropping the

BROPHY, William H. [12 Oct 1863 – 13 Nov 1922] Bisbee has produced a great many real men, every one of whom she is proud, but in the passing of William H. Brophy one of her most illustrious sons has gone. For though it is a fact that his activities took him into many other communities in Arizona and in other states – even into other countries – where he was loved and respected, it was in Bisbee that he made his greatest successes, was loved by his best friends, and it was to Bisbee that he turned when the home-lust burned strongest where he might commune with old friends and true, and look upward to the everlasting hills that had come to be almost a part of his very being. Billie Brophy came to Bisbee when he was a young man and when Bisbee was a young camp. The man and the camp grew up together, their lives were closely interwoven, and while he grew he builded [sic] that Bisbee might be a better place to which to live. A person gets out of a thing just about what he puts into it with a little interest added and the camp rewarded Brophy's efforts, so that he soon same to where he was so richly endowed, he grew into the bigger activities, until he was known as a builder, a big man among men. And he was but entering upon the greater campaigns when he was called. Brophy had not only the respect and admiration of his acquaintances the love of his business associates and the adoration of his family, but he had the faculty of drawing those under him close to his inner self – that faculty of making them realize that he was not only a just and fair employer, but a true and tried friend to whom they could go in times of joy and sorrow with a full expectation of receiving the advice and counsel which can come only from a real interest in every affair – large or small 0 which troubled the soul or made the heart glad. He was above all a fair man, who believed that right should ever prevail, and to that end he was willing to sacrifice all. Intensely patriotic, he felt that his adopted country was entitled to his every effort and he was among the very first to give up his business affairs and turn his tremendous powers of organization toward the success of American arms and the alleviation of suffering among American troops. But in the midst of all his strenuous labors in France he was never too busy to help a Bisbee boy, and to keep many a Bisbee mother whose heart bled informed as to the welfare of her son at the front. And when the labor was done he did not wait for the honors that were justly his, but came back home to take up the burden where he had left off, with the same old friendships and the same joy of living to spur him on. But it is to the young men of this great southwestern country that Billie Brophy left the greatest heritage. He came here with no recommendation save a strong right arm and a willingness to accomplish the task set before him just a little better than was necessary. He invested his labor and his faith in his home in Bisbee, allowing no burden to become too great, no obstacle to cause him to doubt his ability to conquer, and no knocker to tell him that he was wasting his effort. He made himself a part of the business which his employers were conducting without fear that he might give a little more than his employers deserved. He believed in his community and no labor for the good of Bisbee was too small or too great for him to undertake with a whole heart. He became a great man not because of birth, for he was but a poor Irish lad when he came

to Bisbee, but because of a willingness to work, always work, and an abiding faith in the value of giving a little more than was expected. He spent practically all of his life in the employ of others, but by that belief in doing his job a little better than was absolutely necessary, the living of a clean life, and the application of his entire mentality he was able to accumulate a goodly sum of this world's goods. No luck entered into his success, only clean living, careful economy and that ever present spur – work. To the sorrowing family the sympathy of all Bisbee goes out. BURGESS, William. Peculiar Death. A Man Dies in His Room at Bowie Station. Bowie, Ariz. Dec. 31. – William Burgess, aged 35 years, was found dead in his room here last Saturday morning. It is believe that his death resulted from suffocation caused by burning charcoal. Mr. Burgess was an employee of the Depot hotel in the capacity of yard man. He had been accustomed to carry fire to his room in which there was no stove, on an old stove door, using stone coal as fuel. Friday night he substituted charcoal for fuel. Usually when he was ready to retire he set the fire out of the room. Friday night he left the fire in the room. Saturday morning when Burgess did not appear at his usual duties Mr. Riddle went to his room,

but received no answer to frequent knocks on the door. The door was forced open and the man found dead in bed. He had had a severe hemorrhage and it is believed the cause was from the fumes of the burning charcoal. The room was entirely without ventilation. Justice Kelsey held an inquest and the coroner's verdict was in accordance with the above. The deceased was a man of unusual intelligence and had won the respect of all, during his three weeks' stay in Bowie, but his demeanor. Bisbee Daily Review, Bisbee, AZ. BURKE, Charles E. Result of Overdoes of Morphine – Coroner's Inquest. The death of Charles E. Burke, which occurred here at 2:30 Saturday morning, was received with much regret by his many friends and acquaintances who knew him. He was considered an absolutely brave man and enjoyed the confidence of competent men. Burk's death had been expected for some time past as he had been suffering for years from an acute stomach trouble, which caused him excruciating pains, from which at times it was difficult for him to recover. To alleviate this torture the deceased began taking opates (sic) and increased the dose of morphine in proportion to the requirements of each case. The Nature and suddenness of Mr. Burke's death gave rise to some suspicion and a coroner's inquest was held to ascertain if the deceased had committed suicide. The evidence that was given by Miss Margurite, who waited upon Burke, is as follows: "He came home Friday afternoon from Dr. Nichols' office where he had taken some medicine to alleviate his sufferings. From that time on he became irrational and his conversation was disconnected and incoherent. He stated that he had been very sick and shortly afterward lay down and went to sleep. I sent for Dr. Nichols who came but expressed no alarm and went away again without waking him. He woke shortly afterward and said he was better but soon fell asleep again and became violently sick and foamed at the mouth and his eyes became glassy. I could not get Dr. Nichols and summoned Dr. Cavens. When Dr. Cavens come he said it was too late; that nothing could be done." Dr. Cavens stated that the death of Burke was caused by a sudden absorption of an extra amount of morphine that he had taken into his stomach. That his stomach was in a shocking condition and could not withstand the sudden absorption of the drug. This testimony was corroborated by Dr. Nichols. Chas. E. Burk has been a man of many sides and of extraordinary adaptability. He was well connected in the state of Iowa, but generally kept his identity a secret. He has traveled as an all around ministral man, followed the trade of sign painter for many years was chief cook and broiler in the St. Elimo restaurant in Los Angeles. He was a man of powerful physique and for some years was the champion middle weight wrestler and boxes of the Northwest. For years he was associated with Evan Lewis and Jack Kirkeek the two world champion Grece-Roman (sic) wrestlers. For the past four years he has been engaged in games in the Turf and the St. Louis hall. He has \$3000 on deposit. He was a member of the order of Eagles and the funeral at 3 o'clock this afternoon will be conducted by that order. This lodge will also be largely considered in the appointment of an administrator. Concussion of the Brain Caused by a Blow on Head – Young Man was Particularly Bright and Had Brilliant Prospects. Edward Byers, aged seventeen years, who was injured in jumping from a train at French Thursday, died yesterday afternoon at the Copper Queen hospital. In leaping from the train the young man supposedly miscalculated the speed at which it was moving. He was hurled to the ground, striking his head on a canteen he carried. Concussion of the brain resulted. For a time it was thought his injuries were not of series [sic] character, but were of such a character as to remove hope of recovery. The young man was in the employ of the telephone company as a lineman when the accident occurred that cost him his life. He had been detailed to do some repair work and was on his way to the task. Young Byers was unusually enthusiastic in the pursuit of knowledge regarding the uses of electricity, and was considered by those who knew him as giving promise of a brilliant future in the line of work which was his choice.
