CARETTO, Baptiste. State Pioneer Dies at Bisbee. Bisbee, Jan. 16. – Baptiste Caretto, widely known Bisbee business man and Arizona pioneer, died here today. He was 69 years old. Caretto came to Tombstone in 1888 but soon thereafter moved to Bisbee where he made his home ever since. He engaged in the mercantile and real estate business. He served on the Bisbee city council for six years prior to the recent election. He is survived by his widow, four daughters and two sons, and a brother, John Caretto, Bisbee postmaster. CARLEVADO, Fred. Cochise Pioneer Dies At Tombstone. Fred Carlevado, Victim of Consumption, Buried with Many Honors. (Special to Review.) Tombstone, Nov. 4 – Fred Carlevado, one of the pioneers of Cochise County is dead of consumption. He was buried today with honors, the city band attending in a body and a large number of his friends and fellow citizens participating in the funeral services. The deceased was 62 years of age and had been a citizen of Cochise county for the past twenty-five years. He was a member of the Knights of Pythias and of the Red Men and these orders participated in his burial. For many years he has been in the saloon business in this city and was worth a good many thousand dollars in mining stock, real estate and other assets. CHERRY, William H. Cherry Dies From Injuries. Victim of Forest Wreck Died at Hospital Yesterday. Blood Poisoning Set in and Death Followed Soon After – Was Believed That He Would Recover. William H. Cherry the engineer who was injured in the El Paso and southwestern wreck at Forest last Tuesday evening, died at the company hospital yesterday evening at 7:05 o'clock. The cause of his death was blood poisoning, which has been slowly developing since he was injured in the wreck. It was the first thought by the physicians that Cherry would recover from his injuries, though they were admitted to be severe. In the smash up he sustained a compound fracture of the left leg, besides other cuts and bruises. When Cherry's limb was broken the bone projected through the fleshy part of his leg. Dr. Sweet, the head of the hospital department stated last night that the wound was poisoned at the time his leg was broken. At the time grease and dirt filled the wound and before it was cleaned out the blood was poisoned. From day to day, Cherry's condition has been such that the physicians were confident he would recover. The most alarming symptom was a constant high fever, which it was not thought until yesterday indicated such a serious development as blood poisoning. Cherry is one of the best known engineers on the El Paso and Southwestern. He has had several other narrow escapes while on the road, but was considered one of the most careful men in the employ of the company. The fact has not been fully established whether or not he was at fault in the wreck last Tuesday evening. Mrs. Cherry, wife of the deceased has been notified of the death of her husband. She will arrive in the city this morning from Benson and not until then will the funeral arrangements be made. Mrs. Cherry visited at the hospital the day after her husband was brought there, but did not believe him to be seriously enough injured to necessitate her presence at the bedside. CUNNINGHAM, Michael J. Michael Cunningham, Retired Banker at Bisbee, Dies. Bisbee, Aug 5 – Michael J. Cunningham, 81, died this morning at a local hospital where he had been for several weeks. He was in failing health for the past ten years, and had retired from his post as vice-president of the Bank of Douglas several years ago. During the past five years he had remained at his home. Born in San Francisco August 9, 1873, Cunningham came to Tombstone in 1881 with his parents. He was educated in the public schools of California and Arizona, at St. Vincent's College in Lost Angeles and graduated St. Michael's College in Santa Fe. Coming to Bisbee, he was cashier at the Copper Queen store until 1900 when the Bank of Bisbee was organized. He was named cashier of the new bank, becoming president upon the resignation of the late Wm. H. Brophy in 1918, a position he held until 1934 when the Bank of Douglas formed an enlarged banking institution with banks in Douglas, Bisbee and Phoenix. The industrial development of the Southwest owes much to Cunningham. He was one of the original planners of the townsite of Douglas and had a prominent part in the development of that community. He was one of the organizers of the Bisbee Improvement company, the Morenci Water and Light company and earlier Tovrea Packing company. Together with a few other Bisbee citizens he brought the first telephone company into Arizona. Always active in politics, Cunningham served many years as chairman of the Cochise county Democratic central committee and was a member of the state central committee of the Democratic party at the time of his death. He never held elective office in the city, county or state. He was a charter member of the Bisbee lodge of Elks and served as its exalted ruler, as district deputy and as Grand Exalted Ruler of Arizona. He was a great baseball fan, was one of the organizers of the early Cactus league and afterwards participated in the formation of the present Arizona-Texas league. Cunningham was twice married. His first wife, who died in 1912 was formerly Miss Mary I. Goodbody of Tombstone. To this union six children were born: Ellen, Mary Isador and Florence, all of whom reside out of the state and M.J. Jr., Francis and William Cunningham. In 1919, Cunningham married Mrs. Isabella Graham who survives him.
