He attended school at Garden City, Kansas and also attended the University of Michigan at Ann Arbor. Like his father, he entered the cattle business in western Kansas and operated a ranch for 18 years. In 1919 Mr. Eaman married Ella Knox of Garden City. Failing health forced him to leave the cattle business and he served for some time as County and Probate Judge of Kearny County, Kansas. He and his family came to Tombstone in 1947. EARP, Virgil. Bad Man Cashes in His Checks. End of Virgil Earp Who Made History in Tombstone. New has been received of the death of Virgil Earp, who belonged to the noted Earp gang which was a terror to the peaceable citizens of Tombstone during the early history of that now quiet and orderly town. The Earps and their associates furnished much of the early history of this territory on which Alfred Henry Lewis builded his "Wolfville" stories. Virgil Earp, who died this week at Goldfield, Nev., where he has been since that camp first attracted attention, was considered the most dangerous man of the Earp gang and was a dead shot with revolver or rifle. He was sixty-two years old at the time of his death, which was caused by an attack of pneumonia, which killed him in two days after the disease attacked him. Earp was born in Illinois, and traveled to the west with his family, consisting of father, mother, and three brothers. The Earp brothers first attracted attention at Fort Dodge, Kan. where they were parties to many shooting scrapes, but it was at Tombstone where they achieved their greatest notoriety, and from which they were finally driven by an outraged public. Virgil Earp was at one time a United States marshal. After leaving Tombstone the Earps went to California and settled at San Bernardino, where they have since resided most of the time, none of them having ever returned to the territory. Virgil Earp leaves a wife and three brothers – Wyatt, Morgan and Newton, though they are located at different points in California. The father of the Earps is now an inmate of the Soldier's Home at Sawtelle, Cal. Before his death Earp requested that his body be buried at Portland Or., and it was sent there. Several years ago Wyatt Earp attempted to become a famous sport and was referee of the prize fight between Fitzsimmons and Sharkey, giving the fight to Sharkey on a foul. This decision was considered by the great majority to be nothing less than cold-blooded robbery of the money which had been bet on Fitzsimmons and since then Earp has not figured as a sport. EYESLEE, A. Old Timer Gone. A. Eyeslee Passes to Beyond After Short Illness of a Few Days. Apoplexy Caused Death of Barber. Suddenly Stricken Little More Than Week Ago, Man Dies at Noon Yesterday – Had Been in Bisbee 20 Years. The death of A. Eyeslee, which occurred at the Copper Queen hospital in this city yesterday at noon, marks the passing of one of Bisbee's oldest residents, as well as one of the characters of the old frontier days. A. Eyeslee was born at Stattin, Germany, in 1842, leaving him 64 years of age at the time of his death. Coming to America while yet a young man, Eyeslee drifted to the great west in search of his fortune. Like many another he was attracted by the gold excitement of California, and for years made San Francisco his home. He came to Bisbee nearly twenty-three years ago and started at once to ply his trade as a barber. The Eyeslee shop on Main street in this city has been a well-known tonsorial resort among the earliest settlers in the camp. In this little show Eyeslee was able to amass a snug little fortune, which now goes to his wife and five children, all of whom reside in California. At the death bed of the old man were two daughters, Mrs. Fitts of San Jose, Cal., and Mrs. Harrigan of Fresno. Both came to Bisbee at once upon learning of the illness of their father, and have been faithful watchers at his bedside since he was stricken. On Sunday, May 20, Mr. Eyeslee was taken suddenly ill with what

was supposed at that time to be a stroke of paralysis. He was at once removed to the Copper Queen hospital, where medical attendance could be obtained. For a few days the sick man seemed to rally and hopes were entertained for his recovery, but yesterday he suffered an apoplectic stroke immediately following a heartly lunch, and succumbed without scarcely a struggle. He leaves a wife, two sons and a daughter in San Francisco, besides two daughters who are at the present time in Bisbee. Immediately following his removal to the hospital, Mr. Eyeslee called for Attorney J. M. O'Connell and M. J. Cunningham, cashier of the Bank of Bisbee, with which institution he transacted his financial business, and a will was made, making Cunningham executor. Besides the property on Main street where Eyeslee's shop stands, the dead man was possessed of considerable cash and some mining stock. It is understood that upon his request the latter has been disposed of since his illness overtook him. Eyeslee often made the boast that the Main-street property he bought at a very low figure, it taking at that time nearly all his funds. It is a well-known fact today that the property is worth several thousand dollars, measured comparatively with other property in the immediate vicinity.
