FAIRBANKS, N. K. Founder of Fairbank. Last Friday N.K. Fairbanks, after whom the little station of Fairbank was named, died in his home at Chicago, aged 73. Just why the last letter of the deceased's name was left from that of the town has not been learned. Fairbanks was in 1880-1 heavily interested in Tombstone. He owned the Grand Central mine at that place, which flourished in the early days of the camp. He had other holdings in this section of the territory. Superintendent Clawson, who was in Tombstone in early days, stated last night that Fairbanks frequently made trips to Tombstone to look after interests there. He was a shrewd speculator, and made money out of the Grand Central. The deceased entered Phoenix on the first train over the Santa Fe, Prescott and Phoenix. He was one of the promoters of the road. During the celebration in honor of the entrance of the new railroad from the north, Fairbanks mad a speech from the platform of his private car. When Fairbank was named after him it was expected that the place would become the largest city in the territory. For a time it was lively enough, but the decadence of Tombstone left it without any means of support. Mr. Fairbanks was active in charitable work, being one of the founders of the Relief and Aid society and of the St. Luke's society of Chicago. He was born in Wayne county, New York, in 1829, but had lived in Chicago for nearly half a century. He is survived by seven children. Mr. Fairbank's early life was spent in Rochester, N. Y. where he was a journeyman bricklayer. He went to Chicago at an early age and become interested in the manufacture of soap and lard and acquired a considerable fortune. Later he became largely interested in mining in Arizona not far from the border of Mexico, where the well known town of Fairbank was named for him. He became a multi-millionaire, but through speculation lost heavily some years ago. In later years he recuperated his fortune and at the time of his death was considered a man of large wealth. FENTER FAMILY, November 7, 1963 Douglas Couple, Daughter Are Killed When Airplane Crashes. Bodies Found Near Wreckage This Morning. Mr. and Mrs. Dale Fenter and daughter Lori, 2, 1612 11th St., were killed in a one-plane crash about 8:45 a.m. today in the Whetstone Mountains 15 miles northwest of Sierra Vista. The sky was overcast at the time of the accident. First word of the crash was received from an unidentified woman traveling a nearby highway, who reported seeing a plane go down. A search was made by helicopter from Fort Huachuca and within a short time wreckage of a plane was discovered near 7,000-foot Mescal Mountain. The plane was deep in Gardener canyon, several miles from the nearest highway. Due to depth of the canyon and high winds the helicopter could not land. Immediately a crash had been established men from Cochise County Sheriff's Department and Fort Huachuca were dispatched to the scene, having to walk several miles. Fenter is reported to have left Douglas Municipal airport shortly after dawn today, taking his sons, Chris 5, and Larry 3, to the ranch of his parents, Dr. and Mrs. Wert Fenter at Sonoita. He was piloting a four-passenger Bellanca owned jointly by him and Dr. M.V. Gomez. Confusion exists concerning the flight, but it is believed the Fenters were enroute to Bisbee or Douglas from the ranch when the crash occurred. Hubbard Mortuary of Bisbee dispatched an ambulance to the scene. Fenter, born in 1931, attended elementary school at Greaterville, near his parent's ranch at Sonoita. He later attended Tucson High School and graduated in 1958 from University of Arizona College of Law. He moved to Bisbee in 1960 and became deputy county attorney there in May, 1961. Several months later he moved to Douglas and opened a law practice, continuing as deputy county attorney. In October 1961 he became associated with Ben F. Williams Jr. in the firm of Williams & Fenter. Mrs. Fenter was born in January 1935 in Tucson, where she attended elementary and high schools. She attended the University of Arizona, graduating in 1957 with a major in education. She was a member of Beta Sigma Phi sorority and American Association of University Women here, holding offices of vice president in both. She was a member of the Phrateres woman's sorority at the University of Arizona. Mrs. Fenter was also an aviation enthusiast with her husband and recently received her wings when she soloed from Douglas Municipal airport. She has a sister in Tucson; two brothers, Palmer Gruensfelder of Bisbee and Mike Gruensfelder of Tucson. (pictures of Mr. and Mrs. Fenter are included in the article.)

FENTER, Dale. November 14, 1963. Dale Fenter, Wife, Daughter Die Thursday in Light Plane Crash. City of Tombstone legal advisor Dale Fenter, 32, his wife, Mary Ann, 28, and their two-year-old daughter, Lori, of Douglas, died Thursday when their light plane crashed 12 miles north of highway 81 near the Cochise-Santa Cruz county line. Two other children, Chris 5, and Larry 3, were at the ranch home of their grandparents, Dr. and Mrs. Wert Fenter, in the Santa Rita mountains, at the time of the crash. All five members of the Fenter family took off in the Bellanea four passenger plane from Bisbee municipal airport about 7:40 a.m. to fly to their Fenter ranch where the two boys were to spend a few days.

Mrs. Jesse Masingill of the Bisbee airport, told investigators that Fenter landed there about 7:30 and was met by his wife and three children. Mrs. Fenter had apparently driven the family car from Douglas. Weather conditions in southern Arizona Thursday were stormy with rain showers and high winds prevalent near the mountains. First report of the crash was made by Homer Bryant, of the Sands Ranch on the north side of the Whetstone Mountains. Army helicopters from Fort Huachuca immediately began a search for the wreckage, but poor weather conditions made it impossible for it to land after the wreckage was spotted. The plane crashed in Gardener Canyon near 7,000 ft. Mescal Mountain. Border Patrolmen, Sheriff's department men, Huachuca City Police, and Pima County range deputies rushed to the scene. Bodies were brought out over extremely rough terrain and taken to Hubbard Mortuary in Bisbee. No report on the findings of Federal Aviation Agency investigators has been released as yet. Observers near the scene of the crash said that there was a possibility that the plane began breaking up in the air. Weather conditions near Mescal gap were said to be bad and visibility poor at the time of the crash. Fenter, in addition to being legal advisor for the City of Tombstone, was a deputy county attorney

and a classmate of County Attorney Richard Riley. Both Fenter and his wife were graduates of the University of Arizona and both were natives of Tucson. After getting his law degree in 1958 Fenter was associated with the firm of Gentry, McNulty and Kimble in Bisbee. In 1960 he went to Douglas as deputy county attorney and in 1961 joined with Ben F. Williams, Jr., in a partnership law firm. Mrs. Fenter, who held a degree in education from the U. of A. is survived by a sister in Tucson and two brothers, Palmer Gruensfelder of Bisbee and Mike Gruensfelder of Tucson. Fenter was the grandson of pioneer Arizona lawyer Louis G. Hummel and a nephew of Don Hummel, also an attorney and former mayor of Tucson. Fenter was known as an excellent pilot. He had been flying for several years. His wife had been taking flying lessons and had made her solo flight only a few weeks ago. The Bellanca plane was owned jointly by Fenter and Dr. M.V. Gomez of Douglas. Funeral services for Mrs. Fenter and daughter were held Saturday at 9 a.m. from SS. Peter and Paul Catholic Church in Tucson. They were buried in Holy Hope Cemetery. Pallbearers were Dr. Mike Gomez, Ben Williams, Mike Vasquez, and Floyd Nieter, Jr., all of Douglas and Richard Riley and James Whitney of Bisbee. Last rites for Fenter, who was not Catholic, were conducted Saturday at 2 p.m. at Parker-Arizona Mortuary. He was buried in Tucson's Evergreen Cemetery. His pallbearers were Louis Humme, Gene Hummel, Gail Hummel, Riley, Whitney and Williams. Tombstone Epitaph.

FERNUSON, Lizzie. Blame For Death Is Not Fixed By Jury. The coroner's inquest was unable to determine whether Lizzie Fernuson committed suicide or was foully murdered in a house near the Beer Garden early Sunday morning. The jury was positive that the woman met her death as a result of morphine poisoning, but rendered a verdict without fastening the blame upon any person. The verdict said that she met her death as a result of morphine administered by an "unknown hand." The jury was made up as follows: D. A. Murphy, foreman; Thos. Holden, W. A. Young, Peter McIntyre and Louis Sperry. It took them but a few minutes to arrive at a verdict. The inquest was held in the office of Justice McDonald. The room was crowded to the doors during the entire afternoon by a crowd that eagerly listened for testimony of a sensational nature. The fact was brought out that the deceased had three children who are now in New York attending school. One sister lives at 1679 West Atlantic street, Oakland, Cal., and another at New London, Connecticut. These have been communicated with. There is an opinion in the minds of many familiar with the developments in the case that Lizzie Fernuson was murdered for the purpose of shielding some one, who was responsible for her delicate condition. She took medicine last week for the purpose of bringing about an abortion, and this was the knowledge of one, who admits that he was on very friendly terms with the deceased during her life time. The third witness called was George Ruppert, who testified that he saw William Dunn give the woman a white powder on the end of a knife. He asked what was being done, and was warned not to make it any of his business. Marshal Henderson stated that he placed Dunn under arrest, and took from him a package containing a white powder which was afterward declared to be morphine. This package was identified by Ruppert as being the one he saw in the hands of Dunn. Dr. Caven, who attended the dying woman Sunday, stated that she had been poisoned with morphine, and that the package in evidence was morphine. B. H. Wilson stated that he was in the room shortly before the woman died. She called him to her side and tried to tell him who had killed her. All he could hear was "They have poisoned me: they have killed me." Justice McDonald made a hard effort to get him to give the names of those who had given the poison, but Wilson persisted that the woman had been unable to speak the names, though she repeated the other words several times. Robert Neal stated that he was on very friendly terms with the woman and that she had been given poison. He stated that he gave Dunn keys to the woman's room early Saturday. V. H. Igo, proprietor of the Beer Garden, tried to impress the court with the fact that he was trying to keep the people in that vicinity from drinking, even though he is in the liquor business. He stated that the deceased was drinking for three days before her death. Jennie Linthicum swore that Dunn had taken a bottle of morphine from her room and when he returned, stated that he had been giving some of it to the Fernuson woman to quiet her. Bessie Hight could throw but little light on the affair. She stated that Neal had two bottles of morphine a few days before the death of the woman took place. She did not know what he did with it. William Dunn was the last witness placed on the stand. He denied having given the woman any morphine, though he admitted

seeing her take some on the end of a knife or from a spoon. He flatly denied having been in any way responsible for her death. The funeral of Mrs. Fernuson will be held this afternoon at 2 o'clock from the International Undertaking parlors. Bisbee Daily Review, Bisbee, AZ. Tuesday, February 17, 1903.
