HARRALL, R.T. R.T. Harrall, a miner who has been at work in the Holbrook mine, died Friday night about eleven o'clock from heart disease. Harrall went to work as usual about six o'clock, and after going down

in the mine began to feel bad and told the shift boss he was not feeling right and would like to go home. About half past ten J. A. Gibson, who rooms next to Harrall, heard groans and cries of pain coming from Harrall's room and went in to see what was the matter. Gibson found Harrall in bed and suffering very much and complaining about being unable to get his breath and of severe pains about his heart. A telephone message was sent for a doctor and Dr. Hickman responded to the call. He found Harrall to be suffering from what seemed to be a paralytic stroke and did all he could to alleviate the sick man's sufferings. Harrall soon lapsed into unconsciousness and expired shortly after Dr. Hickman's arrival. Coroner Williams was called in and an inquest held. The verdict of the jury was that the cause of the death of the deceased was heart disease. Harrall was well known in Bisbee and other mining camps in the territory, having worked in nearly all of them. He has been at work in Bisbee for five or six month. He leaves a brother, J. M. Harrall, who is proprietor of the Central hotel in Phoenix, who has been notified of his brother's death. The remains are at the undertaking parlors of B.F. Graham & Co. awaiting advice from Phoenix and Prescott. A brother of Harrall at Prescott telegraphed Justice Williams last evening instructing him to have the body interred at this place, and if the deceased was without means the necessary funds would be sent by wire. Crow of the First Baptist Church Thursday at 10 a.m. at the Brown-Page Chapel and burial will be made Sunday in the family plot at Green Lawn Cemetery in Rich Hill, Mo. Hatcher, of Venice, Calif., and three daughters, Mrs. Lorena Bateman of Long Beach, Calif., Mrs. Bertha Brown and Mrs. Mary C. Bond of Douglas. HOLDREN, Thomas. Holdren Dies In City Jail. Was Taken There to Sober Up, But Death Released Him. Deceased Has Been Employed in a Saloon Here, and Was Miner by Occupation – Got Morphine for O'Neill. Thomas Holdren died yesterday afternoon in the city jail, where he had been taken a short time previous on the supposition that he was drunk. It has since developed that he was suffering from disease. Holdren fell in a fit on Brewery gulch during the forenoon, and it was thought that he was too drunk to be at large. Soon after being taken to the jail a physician was summoned. Constables Casad and Doyle went up to the jail yesterday afternoon to see Holdren, and as they entered the place he gave a dying gasp. An effort was made to summon a physician, but before one arrived it was too late for him to be of any assistance. The death of Holdren was told Justice McDonald, and he at once summoned a jury which will meet this morning at 11 o'clock to decide upon a verdict. Those on the jury are George Henninger, Charles Trahl, J. C. Gold, R. H. Hutchinson and G. B. Estes. The jury viewed the body as it lay stretched on the bare floor just inside the door of the jail. Seated near by was a Mexican serving time for being drunk and disorderly. The body was still warm when the jury arrived. Robert Hennessy, of the international undertaking parlors, was notified, and took the body to the morgue. An examination of the remains disclosed no marks of violence, but disclosed the fact that the deceased was suffering from a loathsome disease before his death. It is expected that the inquest this morning will develop the fact that Holdren came to his death from the excessive use of liquor, combined with an affliction from which he could never hope to recover. The deceased was an Englishman by birth, and was about 45 years of age. He was a miner, but since coming to this city has been employed at the St. Louis beer hall in a menial capacity. Holdren gained some notoriety several weeks ago by going after the bottle of morphine which was taken by Daniel O'Neill, who committed suicide in the St. Louis beer hall. Two persons were killed instantly Saturday afternoon as the car in which they were riding was hurled 100 feet when struck by a Southern Pacific troop train eight miles east of Douglas. The dead: Mrs. L.A. Mobley, about 55, wife of the owner of Mobley's ranch, and a long-time resident here. Robert E. Hubbard, about 66, 451 Ninth Street, a worker at the ranch. The accident occurred at 12:50 p.m. at the crossing on Booster Station road, near highway 80. The car, struck squarely in the side, was thrown through a cattle guard and sent somersaulting into a ditch, witnesses said. Mrs. Mobley's body was found near the track 80 feet from the scene of the

crash. Hubbard's body was entangled in the wreckage of the car. The automobile, a 1940 model Chevrolet club coupe, was completely demolished. Mrs. C.H. Jeffers, who lives near the crossing, said she witnessed the accident from her backyard. "Mrs. Mobley was driving toward town from her ranch on a road which parallels the railroad track," she related." the train was only a few feet behind the car. The whistle blew several times. I watched the car, expecting Mrs. Mobley to stop. Instead, she rounded the corner and drove right into the path of the train. Apparently the car windows were closed and she didn't hear the whistle. The train struck the Car with a terrible crash." Mrs. Jeffers said she rushed to the accident scene. Mrs. Mobley and Hubbard both were dead, she related. The train stopped at the crossing several minutes, then proceeded into Douglas. Hubbard's body was removed from the car wreckage an hour later. Both bodies were taken to Brown-Page. Peace Justice E. L. Steward, who investigated the accident, said an inquest will be held as soon as members of the train crew can be contacted. Police said the wreck brought to five the number of persons killed in the Douglas area during 1945 in automobile accidents. Mrs. Mobley, well-known in Douglas, is reported to have come to Arizona in 1900 from Texas. She lived in the Gila River area before moving here. The Mobley ranch in recent years has been the scene of many barbecues and rodeos.
