LAURENCE, John. Feb 19, 1914 - Mar 17, 1983. Folks pay respect to John Laurence by Clyde Roberts. John Robert Laurence, a prominent retired Willcox businessman, died on March 17, 1983 at TMC in Tucson, Arizona. He was born in Iredell, Texas on February 19, 1914. He originally joined the Methodist Church in Abilene, Texas, later transferring his membership to the Willcox United Methodist Church. John married Mildred Culwell in the First Methodist Church in Childress, Texas on Oct 12, 1941. He was inducted into the Air Force in May 1942. John served two and a half years overseas in England. He was awaiting shipment to Japan when peace was declared. He received his honorable discharge from Fort Sam, Houston, Texas on Sept 13, 1945. John operated a drug store in Anton, Texas after his discharge. He and Millie came to Willcox in 1954 with their two sons, Joe and Gary. They farmed for two years. Beginning in 1956 the couple owned and operated a seed, fertilizer and insecticide business in Willcox, which they operated until Oct. 1980. Their business, known as the Lawrence Company, began with less than \$200 in cash but was based on a firm commitment of honesty and integrity. It grew and prospered during all the years of their ownership despite the fact that seven other businesses in their field came and went. During John's life in Willcox, his special qualities of goodness and faith showed immediately. Although a quiet man, his faith in God and his fellowman were ever present and influenced all those he was associated with. Speaking at the John R. Laurence service at the Willcox United Methodist Church, Rev. James O'Neal said: "I truly saw God's will and action in those last long seven days of John's life. I experienced how God's love can triumph if we let it work within our lives. "Doctors and nurses were moved by the action of this family to become better persons. God's love was always there, and John's legacy will grow and grow." The Rev. O'Neal read a number of letters of tribute to John Laurence. Every letter illustrated the fact that John's life touched theirs deeply and influenced it for the better. The Rev. Elbert Morford, longtime friend and former pastor of John Laurence and his family, followed O'Neal at the service. He said: "John Laurence was raised in a home of love, faith and affection. This love carried forth in John's life and reached many persons with whom he associated. "He let his life speak his testimony and he created his life on the goodness of God." Rev. Morford also spoke of his longtime and valued association with John and his family. This writer knew John Laurence well and knows how John's qualities of goodness touched all people he was associated with. His wife noted how Dr. Moldow, a Tucson doctor who knew John only a year, spoke of his association with her husband. He told her: "I want you to know in attending him that I felt there was something exceptionally special about this man, he inspired me to become a better man." A son, Joe R. Laurence, preceded him in death, dying in action with U.S.. Marines in 1968 at the age of 19. He is survived by his wife, Millie; one son, Gary; daughter-in-law, Julie; two granddaughters, Lisa Darlene, 7, and Kimberly, 5, all of Willcox. He is also survived by a brother, Clyde Laurence and his wife, Jackie, Claude, Texas; a sister, Vera Clay and her husband, Herbert of Muleshoe, Texas. LEHEW, J. C. Explosion Of Boiler. Fatal Accident Occup???? Copper Queen Smelter Yesterday. Douglas, Ariz., Jan. 24. One of the boilers exploed at? o'clock this afternoon at the Copper Queen smelter. J. C. Lehew, a ? man, was standing near and in front of the boiler at the time of the explosion. More than a ton of brick from the setting in which the boiler was encased fell on him. Death was instantaneous, without a doubt, as when he was taken from the under the debris a few minutes later nearly all the large bones in his body were found to be broken. Only one arm was left sticking from the pile of hot bricks which covered him. As soon as the heat and steam subsided sufficiently to allow people to approach, the crushed body of Lehew was dragged from the ruins and taken to the office of the time keepers, close by. Judge McDonald was notified by phone and he empaneled a coroner's jury to inquire into the cause of the death of Lehew. The dead man is from Baird, Calhoun county, Texas, and has been working at the smelter as a fireman for some time. The exploded boiler was a new one which had not been used for some time. It was only placed in commission again yesterday. The cause of the explosion is not known as yet. Nobody seems to know as yet to whom the blame will attach for the accident, if indeed it will attach to anyone. The officials at the smelter very properly refused to talk previous to the coroner's inquest. The works at the smelter suffered little delay on account of the explosion, as the ruined boiler was cut out and the business proceeded pretty much as usual. The loss from the explosion, however, must have been quite extensive. Lehew seemed to be a man of some thirty years of age. LEIVA, Simon. Mexican Killed In The Douglas Smelter. Brakeman On Ore Train At Copper Queen Smelter Badly Cut Up. Jumped From Car and Fell Beneath Wheels, Four Cars Passing Over Him - Coroner's Verdict Says Death Was Caused by Accident. Douglas Ariz., Nov 27 – (Special.) – Simon Leiva, a Mexican brakeman on the Copper Queen smelter ore train, was killed Saturday night about 10 o'clock. The train brings ore from the ore beds to the feed floor of the smelter. He was on the rear end of the train which was backing up. As he jumped from the car to throw the switch his pants caught and he was thrown under the wheels. Four cars passed over him and he was badly cut up. Judge McDonald empaneled a coroner's jury this morning, which returned a verdict to the effect that "deceased came to his death accidentally." The verdict of the jury was as follows: "In the matter of the inquisition on the body of Simon Leiva, deceased, we, the jury summoned to appear before W. G. McDonald, justice of the peace, on the 27th day of November, 1905, having been duly sworn and hearing the evidence, we find: Deceased was named Simon Leiva, aged about thirty years, a native of Mexico; that he came to his death on the 25th of November, 1905, by accident. "J.B. Speed, C.J. Lachance, E. D. Herr, Andy Scott, C. E. Duggan, J. S. Boon." Deceased resided at Pirtleville with his father and sister. They came her (sic) from Fronteras, where deceased has a brother. The remains of Leiva were buried this afternoon at 3 o'clock, the Copper Queen company bearing the expense. LIN, Hung. Chinaman Used Queue To Kill Himself. Wrapped His Pigtail About His Neck and Choked to Death. Deceased Was Apprehended at Fairbank By Connel. (Special Correspondence.) Tombstone, Dec. 28. – Hung Lin, a citizen of the Celestial Empire, who was confined in the county jail, being held as a United States prisoner, charged with being unlawfully in the country, committed suicide last night by hanging himself. Lin as confined in one of the steel tanks on the west side of the jail, in the door of which is a small barred opening which is about four feet from the ground. When the door of the tank is shut it is impossible for the guards to look into the tank without going directly up to this small opening. Lin made considerable preparations for taking his life. He first removed all of his clothing; next he undid his queue, and passing it around one of the small bars in the opening to the door and then around his throat, tied it together. He then slid his feet out from under him and let the weight of his body hang by the queue until he had choked to death. The front part of the neck was cut somewhat by the silk cord which bound the end of his queue. He must have been game to deliberately allow himself to choke to death when by raising up on his feet he could have removed what suffering he must have endured, but his feet were slid out as far as he could make them go. The body was found soon after the deed was done, by the guards of the jail when they changed shirts about midnight. Lin was arrested in this city on Saturday last by Chinese Inspector Connell at the depot just as he stepped from the train, where a vegetable Chinese from Fairbank was there to meet him. It has developed since that Lin had just come across the line from Hermosillo, Mexico, evidently eluding the immigration inspectors along the line, as he had no "chock ghee." Last night Immigration Inspector Connell visited the jail and took the measurements of Lin so as to keep a description of him. This proceedings, no doubt, caused the chink to think that something dreadful was about to happen, perhaps that Connell was taking his measurement for a coffin and that he would be ready for it in the morning. At any rate he has saved the government the expense of his deportation, but will probably cost the county the expenses of his burial unless the friends of the deceased at Fairbank take charge of the funeral. Lin was to have his examination before the court commissioner the next day. As soon as the body was discovered Coroner McFarland was notified, who, with a jury viewed the remains at the jail, and then adjourned to the coroner's office bringing in a verdict to the effect that the deceased's name was Hung Lin. LYALL, Kate. Grandma Lyall Taken By Death. Redoubtable Cochise County Pioneer Passes On. San Simon, July 26. – (Special) – One of Arizona's oldest pioneers, Mrs. Kat Lyall, died of a heart attack yesterday morning, July 25, at her home here. "Grandma" Lyall, as she was familiarly known to everyone in the San Simon valley, was born December 24, 1856, near Visalia, Calif., to Mr. and Mrs. P. E. Esshom in what is known as the Esshom valley. She was next to the oldest of nine children, Mrs. Mary Sweeny of Kingman, Arizona, being the only surviving member of the family. Her parents, who homesteaded and owned large holdings around Visalia of cattle and sheep, had their property, through "floating Spanish land grants"

swept away. They then started to Oregon to a homestead granted them by the government, but instead settled on the San Joaquin river north of Vilsalia at Four Creeks. While still a small child her parents moved from there to Porterville, Calif., where "Grandma" often told tales of the Indians that made her hair, as a child "stand on end." At one time she told of how the Indians killed a woman and two children, and how later the pioneers captured the Indians, stringing them to a tree less than a half mile from their home. Later To Arizona. At the age of 18 her mother died, and she went to live with an uncle, Rhee Phillips, who lived on the King river. While there she met Joe Lyall and Feb. 17, 1877, they were married in Tulare, Calif., settling on the Tulare river at the head of Tulare lake. The young bride from the very beginning assumed the roll of a real pioneer mother. When Mrs. Lyall was 30 years old the family moved to Sulphur Springs valley following her husband's father, Ambrose Lyall, who had settled several years earlier at Elfrida near Douglas. From Elfrida the family moved to Steins, New Mexico, operating a large cattle ranch through Animas valley. From there they went to Solomonsville in order to put their children in school: then later back near Steains in the "Little Doubful Canyon" famous in the Butterfield stage days as one of the most dangerous passes in the Indian and bandit country. There she bought cattle, and despite early deprivations and pioneer struggles, she made a prosperous ranch. Kindly Character. During all her years she was never known to let a man go hungry, whether cowboy, bandit, or even the Indian, who was so dreaded during the fierce Apache raids. The Indians and bandits alike respected "Grandma" and her property, although in the beginning there were several skirmishes that were practically miniature wars. "Doubtful" Adams, an Apache Indian, had his life, while a child, saved through the efforts of several citizens including Mr. Lyall, their protection from Apaches, probably due to this incident. Three children survive including Arch Lyall of San Simon, Guy J. Lyall of Lordsburg and Mrs. O. Y. Olney of Miami. A son, Henry, was killed in a railroad explosion in 1910 near Ray, Arizona.
